The six-man team were on site for three months and subcontractors were used to install the roller doors and windows in the office area of the building.

As part of a trading standards requirement there are two certificates that we are awarded with – one is an EC Certificate of Factory Production Control and the other a Welding Certificate.

Following a training course, Colin Docherty has become a Responsible Welding Coordinator and has been added to the Welding Certificate.

From July 2014 manufactured structural steel made in the UK or imported must comply with the CPR (Construction Products Regulation) and CE Marking requirements and this audit ensures the company's continued compliance.
